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Background Context

This is the thirteenth quarterly mandate maintenance report produced by the Ngātiwai Trust Board (NTB) for the Office of Treaty Settlements (OTS) following the Crown's recognition of the NTB Deed of Mandate (DoM) on 21 October 2015.

The purpose of this report is to document the work undertaken by the NTB to maintain its mandate and in particular to demonstrate its ongoing commitment to continually improve its communications and engagement with Ngātiwai members so as to keep members properly informed about the negotiations and Treaty settlement journey.

Mandate Maintenance requirements

Section 55 of the Deed of Mandate states:

"The NTB will ensure that Ngātiwai members are kept regularly informed and updated on negotiations progress through:

- monthly newsletters/e-panui and website with regular updates
- hui or wananga on particular topics will be held regularly through the year
- the AGM or a Special General Meeting where the need arises (i.e. to present an iDoS and a proposal for a PSGE to the claimants community for approval and ratification)
- Negotiators will also be required to report to Te lwi o Ngātiwai on negotiations as required by the NTB (see page 22)
- monthly Board meeting summaries to be released following each meeting providing regular updates on matters under discussion by the Board and
- Three additional hui-a-iwi (in addition to the AGM) in total providing quarterly opportunities for engagement and discussion.

The focus will be on the progress of negotiations."

Section 56 of the Deed of Mandate states:

"The NTB will provide regular three monthly reports to OTS to maintain the mandate. It will include information about:

- communications with Ngātiwai (i.e.newsletters/e-panui, hui or wananga, website and Facebook updates),
- any AGMs or SGM held within the reporting period, and
- any other points of interest related to the progress of negotiations."

While it is acknowledged that the OTS have a standard form for mandate maintenance reports this report covers those requirements and builds on the previous commitments made by the Board in its Engagement and Communications Plan dated 13 December 2014. For this reason it includes a brief summary of progress made towards achieving specific objectives established in December 2014.

Issues Arising 1 November 2018 – 31 January 2019

Terms of Negotiation and The Ngātiwai Mandate Report

- 1. Completion of Terms of Negotiations (ToN) were paused pending the outcome of the Ngātiwai Mandate Inquiry by the Waitangi Tribunal and remain paused.
- 2. The Board participated in a ho hou i te rongo with Patuharakeke at Takahiwai Marae on Sunday 18 November 2018. This was only a beginning in the rebuilding of the relationship between the Board and Patuharakeke with further hui to follow and mediation yet to be discussed.
- 3. The third wananga-a-iwi in the series was due to take place from 16 to 17 November 2018 at Ngunguru Marae but had to be postponed until 2019 due to a number of clashing dates with other significant hui (notably the Ngāpuhi evolved mandate hui).
- 4. The Board worked to develop a DRAFT mandate mediation proposal based on the recommendations from the Waitangi Tribunal in the Ngatiwai Mandate Report (Wai 2561). This involved collecting quotes for specialist advice (i.e. legal advice and historian services) and compiling an overall budget to put to the Crown for funding mediation.
- 5. On 6 December 2018, the Board requested a meeting with the Minister to discuss the DRAFT proposal.

Overlapping Claims with other Iwi / Large Natural Groupings

- 6. On 9 November 2018, the Waitangi Tribunal granted urgent hearings for six mandated iwi applicants including the Ngatiwai Trust Board.
- 7. During November 2018, the Board continued work to update the amended Statement of Claim to include all new processes, redress and events that took place since the original claim was filed in 2017. Updated briefs of evidence were also worked on in preparation for the inquiry hearings.
- 8. The Minister confirmed that the Hauraki Settlements will be paused while the Hauraki Overlapping Claims Inquiry take place. The hearings were scheduled to be held in Wellington from 8 to 12 April 2019.

Marine and Coastal Area Act (MACA)

- 9. On 18 January 2019, the Board filed evidence in relation to the Waitangi Tribunal's MACA Kaupapa Inquiry. The hearings were scheduled to be held in Wellington from 25 to 29 March 2019. The scope of this inquiry is targeted at the legislative framework and applications process established under the MACA Act 2011.
- 10. The Board contacted an historian in November 2018 to seek advice on preparing a research plan for the MACA High Court applications process.
- 11. The Board sought and received from OTS an indicative map showing all Ngatiwai related MACA applications. The map will be useful in identifying gaps in the Ngatiwai rohe where no Ngatiwai related MACA applications were filed by the deadline of 3 April 2017. It will also be useful to identify overlapping Ngatiwai applications for discussion purposes.

Communications and Engagement with Ngātiwai Whanui

Open Door Policy and Face to Face Engagement Hui

1. Progress on this objective has been maintained.

Monthly Board Updates and Newsletters

2. Monthly Board meeting summaries are now regularly posted to our website and Facebook pages following each Board meeting. They are also included in our newsletter which is then sent to our Kaumātua by post along with a hard copy of the newsletter.

Trust Deed Review

3. The review continues to suffer from loss of membership.

Wananga Planning for PSGE

4. The Board is currently working on planning a series of wananga with the Kāhui Kaumātua with this topic to be included at some point.

Quarterly Hui-a-lwi (or AGM)

5. The AGM was held on 1 December 2018 at the ASB Leisure Centre in Kensington. Approximately 60 people attended the AGM, 45 of whom confirmed that they were Ngatiwai members when they signed the attendance register.

Finalise the Strategic Communications Plan

6. The plan has been completed and is available on our website for public view.

Review, refine and maintain the current database

- Regular address updates and new registrations continue to be promoted and received.
- 8. The total number of registered members as at 31 January 2019 is 8109 (including 17 pending registrations). This is an increase of 46 registered members within the quarter.
- 9. The registered members who are recorded as without a known postal address or are recorded as Gone-No-Address (GNA) is 926 or 11%.
